STUDENT VERIFICATION FORMS

Please look for these important forms that will be sent home this week. We ask that you complete them as thoroughly as possible and return them to school as quickly as possible so that we have the necessary safety contacts and medical information on file for your child. PARKING SAFETY REMINDERS

Here are some important safety reminders:



Slow down and take your time.

Only park in designated areas. Do not stop in the middle of the road or pull up onto the curbs or park along the side with the 'no stopping' signs.

Do not walk along behind where the cars are parked

If your child/ren exit out the back of the school, arrange to meet them along Princess Street behind the school as there is lots of parking available.

VOLUNTEERS IN THE SCHOOL:

Throughout the year, we often have parent volunteers helping out with a variety of events and activities. The majority of the time, the volunteering is done in the classroom or in a setting where the teacher is also with the students. However, there are times that a volunteer may be with children without a teacher or school district employee. In those circumstances, we will now be required to have criminal record checks done for those situations, this includes parent drivers for field trips and sports teams. There is an online system that the district is using to apply for your check. Please get information on record checks from the school office.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

This group is an opportunity for grades 5 to 7 students to work on building their leadership skills and making a difference around their school and community. Application forms go out next week. We are planning a trip to We Day in Vancouver for some of the student leaders in October (limited number of tickets). Created by Free the Children to celebrate the power of young people to create positive change, We Day is a day-long event that ignites a year-long program for change, called We Schools in Action. In cities across Canada, the event brings inspirational speeches and performances to young leaders. Students then bring that energy home to take action on local and international issues all year long. Watch for information about our first special school wide event soon.
