ROOTS OF EMPATHY PROGRAM

This year, Ms. Lauren's Kindergarten class will be participating in the Roots of Empathy program. program builds empathy in children as it allows the class to "adopt" a baby for the school year and learn about the baby's growth and development. With the Roots of Empathy Instructor, Kirstin Funke-Robinson, who is our school psychologist, the students will have a lesson each week to learn about important topics such as safety, emotions, and communicating. Once every 3 weeks, a baby named Ty and his mom will join the Kindergarten class. The students will measure, weigh, and observe the many developmental milestones that Ty will achieve, such as reaching for a toy, rolling over, sitting up, and perhaps The students will be learning about human development in a very concrete way as it unfolds in front of them and as they share observations of "their baby" at play. Connections will be made with the students between caring for infants and caring for one another. As the year progresses, please feel free to check-out our Roots of Empathy bulletin board in the hallway outside of the Kindergarten classroom to see what we've learned most recently about our baby Ty. A special bonus this year is that our Roots of Empathy parent is Dr. Browning, one of our very own Bayview teachers!
