PARKING SAFETY REMINDERS

VOLUNTEERS IN THE SCHOOL:

BC FRUIT & VEGETABLE PROGRAM





This is directly related to our school's Code of Conduct. We are focusing on 'doing the right thing' even when no one is watching. All staff describe, teach ish) on October 31st. and practice, acknowledge, and reteach whenever needed. We are reviewing our school matrix and 'Bayview ROCKS' (Respect, Ownership, Cooperation, your child to school in a costume, please be mindful Kindness, Safety) and reviewing using WITS (Walk Away, Ignore, Talk it Out, Seek Help) as a problem solving strategy.

ABSENTEE INFORMATION

If your child is going to be away, please call the school before school begins (250)754-3231. If the answering machine is on, please leave a message stating your child's full name, grade and teacher's name and the reason for the absence.

SCHOOL SAFETY AND SUPERVISION

Morning supervision does not start until 8:25am. Please do not send your child to school before 8:25am unless they are attending a school sponsored activity or the morning Breakfast Program. This year we will have morning supervision at the front of the school as well as the back. There is very brief after school supervision. Students are asked to leave the school grounds right after school unless they are supervised by an adult picking them up.

This is one of those things that we ask for parents and students to use good judgment and to pick costumes that respect the viewer and the wearer.



Fire Safety at Home

Keep your family safe with a working smoke alarm in every bedroom.

Did you know that roughly half of home fire deaths result from fires reported between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when most people are asleep?



Smoke alarms save lives. If there is a fire in your home, smoke spreads fast and you need smoke alarms to give you time to get out. In fact, having a working smoke alarm cuts the chances of dying in a reported fire in half!

When it comes to smoke alarms, it's about "location, location, location".

The key message of 2015's Fire Prevention Week campaign was to install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms.

Lockdown and Hold & Secure Drills

All schools in SD68 have Lockdown and Hold & Secure procedures in place. These important practices aim to ensure the safety of staff and students.

When we would Lockdown...

There is a major threatening incident or threat of school violence within the school, or in relation to the school. Students and staff are out-of-sight and secured in the school.

When we would Hold & Secure...

There is an ongoing situation outside and not necessarily related to the school. The school continues to function normally, with the exterior doors being locked.

How you can help...

It is natural for children to feel some anxiety about emergency procedures and drills; calm adults are the best support we can offer. The aim of practice drills is to make emergency procedures calm, routine and effective. Parents can discuss the drills with their child and reassure them that they are safe.
